What data will we collect about you?

We collect:

- Parent/Carer details, which may include the following:
 - o Name/s
 - o Address
 - o Email
 - o Telephone number
 - Date of birth
 - o Date of birth
 - Benefit Information
 - National Insurance Number
- Pupil/student details which may include the following:
 - o Name/s
 - o Address
 - o Gender
 - o Date of birth
 - Name of school/Nursery

What will we use your data for?

We only use the data you give us to work out whether a child is eligible for free school meals, and to keep in touch with parents/carers about the decision and any questions they may have.

We also use the data to make weekly checks on entitlement for free school meals while your child attends a West Berkshire School, as your circumstances might change.

Who will see your data?

Your data will only be seen by authorised West Berkshire Council staff in the Education service, and youur child's current school. They will only be notified of the entitlement and not the personal details you provide on the application form.

Why do we do this?

Under the Education Act 1996, children are entitled to a free school meal if their parent's receive the relevant benefits. West Berkshire Council checks entitlement using a system made available to Local Authorities by the Department for Education.

The processing that the Council undertakes is therefore related to its legal duties under that Act, and also in the public interest in its role as a Local Education Authority.

^{*} After an initial application for free school meals is received, further information may be required – for example, if we can't confirm your entitlement using the department for educations (DFE) checking system we may need to see a benefit statement/letter that confirms the benefits you receive.

How long will your data be kept?

Your data will not be kept any longer than necessary. You can check how long the organisation will keep each type of data against West Berkshire Council's retention schedule (www.westberks.gov.uk/retention).

How is your data stored and processed?

Your data will be held electronically on West Berkshire Council's network, with access limited to authorised staff, and will be protected using up-to-date technical and organisational security measures.

Transfer overseas

Your data will not be stored or sent outside of the UK.

Your rights

Complaints
