- If you do not complete the SIF (this form) and return it to the school with all supporting documentation by the closing date, your child will not be placed in the correct oversubscription category and this is likely to affect your child's chance of being offered a place.
- **The SIF must be properly signed and dated by a priest and a parent/carer where applicable.**
- **Remember, you MUST also complete a Common Application Form (CAF) from your Local Authority. Without a completed CAF, the submission of this form is NOT a valid application.**

It is necessary for us to process special category data for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller (Article 6(1)(e) of the GDPR). Additionally, processing is necessary for reasons of substantial public interest on the basis of Union or Member State law which is proportionate to the aim pursued and which contains appropriate safeguards (Article 9(2)(g) of the GDPR).
8. If the application is successful, the information you have provided on this form will be migrated to the School's enrolment system, and the data will be retained and processed on the basis of the School's fair processing notice and data protection policies which apply to that data.
